

Suggested 2011 Summer Reading List for Students Entering Pre-First Grade

To encourage continued growth in reading skills through the summer, the following list of titles has been compiled by the classroom teachers and media specialist to assist children and parents in the selection of books. Books that can help a child learn to read may be identified by such characteristics as repetitive language patterns or story patterns or the use of familiar sequences such as numbers, days of the week, or hierarchal patterns. It is not necessary to limit choices to these titles, as there are many excellent books also available through your local library.
